WGSS 306 examines issues of Indigenous women's health in Hawai'i, Pacific, and North American regions. By engaging multiple spheres of health (physical, psychological, cultural), we will discuss precolonial traditions, historic oppressions, intergenerational trauma, gendered and sexual violence against native women, biopolitics of embodiment, ableism, issues of equity intersecting the Western medical industrial complex. While attending to relations among individuals/collective, human/more-than-human, and queer kinships, we will explore current cultural practices and women's activism to ensure increased health for our communities. How can an Indigenous feminist view help us articulate body sovereignty? What does it mean to decolonize health? How do we envision futures beyond resilience?

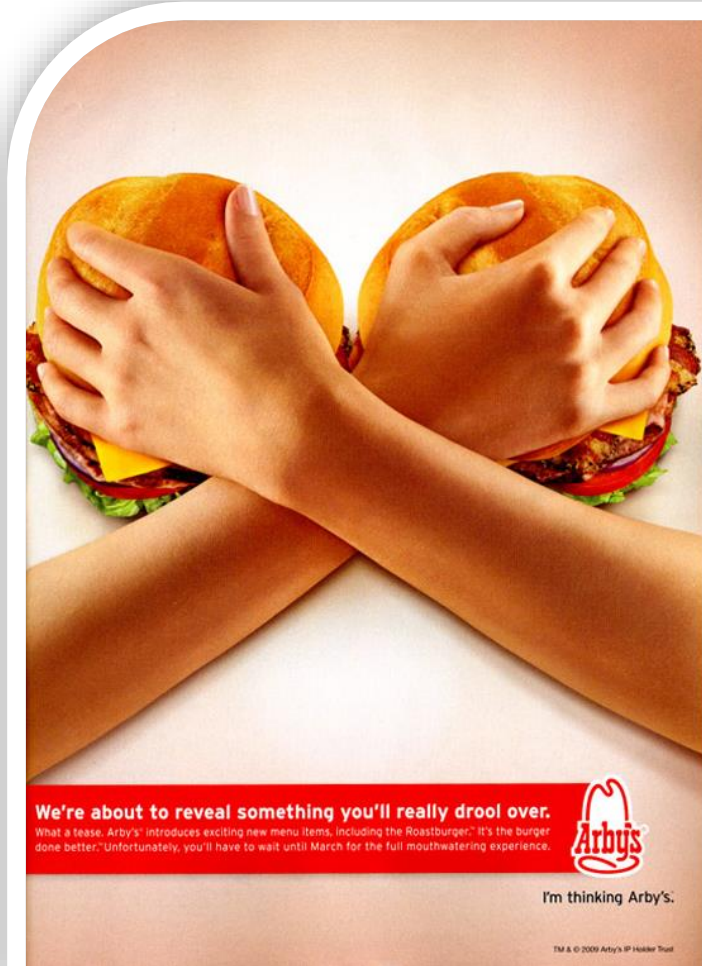
