While attending to relations among individuals/collective, human/more-than-human, and queer kinships, we will explore current cultural practices and women's activism to ensure increased health for our communities. How can an Indigenous feminist view help us articulate body sovereignty? What does it mean to decolonize health? How do we envision futures beyond resilience?




